

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 8 FOR 1987

ORDINANCE NO. 969

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE SALE OF VEHICLES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The City of Sweet Home does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

(a) No person shall park or cause to be parked upon any roadway or private property any vehicle displaying any sign, picture, transparency, advertisement or mechanical device for the purpose of advertising or which advertises or brings notice to any person, verbal or otherwise, the fact that the vehicle is to be sold.

(b) Exceptions to subparagraph (a) herein are as follows:

(1) Vehicles displayed by a car dealer who is authorized and duly licensed by the State of Oregon at his approved car lot.

(2) One (1) vehicle displayed on the private property deeded to or being purchased on contract by the registered owner of the vehicle, provided that it is not displayed for the purpose of operating a car sales business, and said advertising sign, etc. is not more than 10" x 12" and includes name, address and telephone number of the registered owner of the vehicle.

(3) One (1) vehicle displayed on private property rented by the registered owner of the vehicle where he resides or regularly operates a business, provided that it is not displayed for the purpose of operating a car sales business and said advertising sign, etc., is not more than 10" x 12" and includes name, address and telephone number of the registered owner of the vehicle.

Section 2.


(a) Violation of this ordinance constitutes an infraction and may be prosecuted under the provisions of Sweet Home Ordinance No. 876 as now enacted or hereafter amended.

(b) The City of Sweet Home may abate any vehicle that violates this ordinance by following the procedures for abatement set forth in Sweet Home Ordinance No. 952, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

(c) The remedies, which include any penalties, provided for in this ordinance shall be cumulative and not exclusive and shall be in addition to any and all other remedies available to the City of Sweet Home.

Section 3. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
