ORDINANCE NO. _957

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 900 FOR THE DISPOSITION OF LOST PROPERTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

The City of Sweet Home does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 900, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. If any money or goods valued at less than \$25.00 is found and the City of Sweet Home takes possession of the money or goods, the owner of the money or goods being unknown, the Police Department shall post on the bulletin board in the main corridor of the City Hall of the City of Sweet Home notice of the find-The notice shall be so posted for thirty (30) consecutive days and shall state the general description of the money or goods found, and the final date before which the money or goods shall be returned to the finder or placed in the general fund of the City of Sweet Home. This section shall not be interpreted to mean that the City of Sweet Home must take possession of money or goods valued at less than \$25.00, and possession or custody shall not attach to the City because an employee thereof looks at or inspects the money or goods.

Section 2. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 900, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. All money or goods not identified and claimed after the above notice has been given by the City of Sweet Home shall be returned to the person who delivered the money or goods to the City of Sweet Home. If said person cannot be located, or is a police officer, then the money or goods shall be turned over to the City of Sweet Home, to be disposed of, liquidated where necessary, and the proceeds, if any, deposited in the general fund of the City of Sweet Home.

Section 3. Section 3 of Ordinance No. 900, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. This ordinance shall apply to all found money or goods now held by the Sweet Home Police Department.

Section 4. Emergency Clause. It is hereby adjudged

and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, and safety, and owing to the urgent necessity, an emergency is hereby declared to exist; and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
