

Sankey Park - 877 14th Avenue:

The first developed park of Sweet Home, Sankey has 16.85-acres which includes a newly installed playground structure, historic Weddle Bridge, a clubhouse, gazebo, picnic tables, a BMX course, restrooms, and trash cans. The area is largely grass turf with many mature fir trees in the area providing ample shade for visitors.



Ashbrook Park - 2800 Juniper Street: The grassy 1.4-acre neighborhood park provides a gravel walking path, playground equipment, swings, picnic tables, a half-sized basketball court, and an exercise station.

Hobart Natural Area - 900 35th Avenue: This 60-acre natural habitat is comprised of 15-acres of wetlands and 45 acres of woodland hillside. The area also contains the identified endangered species, Bradshaw's lomatium, and the rare Methuselah's Beard lichen.

Coming Soon! Quarry Park - 3101 Zelkova Street: This 207-acre undeveloped area has multiple fishing ponds and sits along the South Santiam River. The Sweet Home City Council is reviewing the future improvements. Stay tuned!

Clover Memorial Park - 1470 1st Avenue: This 1-acre park is named after the late Sweet Home Police Chief Roy Clover and is home to the Whittemore Bridge, crossing Stone Brook Creek. There are also easily accessible benches and picnic tables in this beautiful oasis.

South Hills Trail - A 1.3 mile Level 1 nature walk, the soft surface path has benches, wildlife viewing & dog stations with connections to Sankey Park and other parks. Strawberry Park - 1340 Westwood Lane: This 3.2-acre neighborhood park is located on the west side of Sweet Home. The park has an open field with wetlands, scattered trees, benches, picnic tables, BBQ grill, and a small playground.

Skate Park - 1990 Long Street: This is a 10,000 sq ft cement pad with 16 skateboard features, bleachers, trashcans, and a porta-potty. **Evergreen Loop - 1400 Evergreen Lane:** This is a neighborhood "pocket" park with a picnic table & a few shade trees.

Northside Park - 1780 11th Avenue: Borders the South Santiam River, with a large grassy area, picnic tables, restrooms, BBQ grill, drinking fountain, play equipment including swings, tennis court, horseshoe pits, basketball court and an indoor racquetball facility.


